### £100 wooden box is worth every penny of £6m

To the sellers, it was "Daddy's bar" — a wooden box their late father bought for £100 in 1970 and used as a drinks cabinet. The auctioneers disposing of their father's estate knew better and sold it for £6.3 million.

"Daddy's bar" is a Japanese chest of cedar and gold lacquer made in Kyoto 1640 by the master craftsman Koami Nagashige for the Dutch East India Company. In 1658 it was bought by Cardinal Mazarin, the chief minister of France, and later

bought and sold by a series of British collectors, its provenance somehow being forgotten.

The man who bought it in 1970 was a French engineer who lived in London. He retired to the Loire Valley, where the auctioneer, Aymeric Rouillac, based in Tours, recognised it. Menno Fitzki, of the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam, which bought it, said: "The thing to note about this chest is that it is the best of the best. It was the best when it was made and the same still applies today. It is worth every penny."



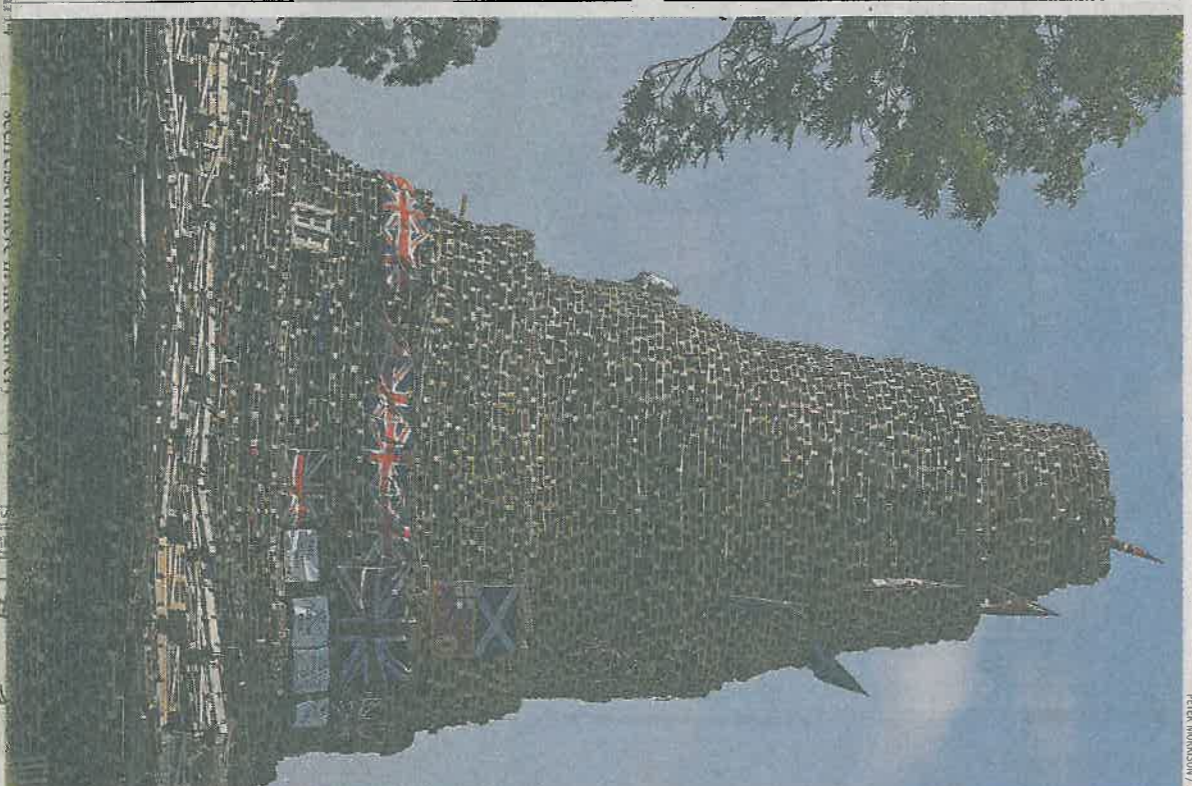
A teenager who killed a "promising" A-level pupil with a single stab to the heart was jailed for a minimum of 13 years yesterday (Kat Lay writes).

### Knife death sentencing

Dogan Ismail, 17, was stabbed by Dawda Jallow, 15, as he tried to recover a BlackBerry stolen from another boy two days earlier. Jallow was ordered to serve at least 13 years of a life term by Judge Christopher Moss at the Old Bailey, who also lifted an order granting him anonymity as a minor.

On December 28 last year, a 15-year-old boy had his phone stolen on the Aylesbury Estate, in Waltham, South London. Dogan returned with the boy to try to reclaim it. They confronted Jallow, who went into a flat and came out with a large knife, stabbing Dogan, who died at the scene.
